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LINGUISTICS WORKSHOP

On 22nd February, a selection of Modern Foreign Languages students from across Key Stage 3, 4 and 5 were fortunate enough to attend a short lecture and 2 linguistics workshops by Dr Laura Bailey, a Senior Lecturer in Linguistics at the University of Kent. This is a fantastic opportunity for language learners to see languages in a more comprehensive point of view and also increase their curiosity in observing languages in their daily lives. Here are some reflections from the students:

'The talk allowed us to explore the field of linguistics (the study of the use of language in daily communication) and hence gain a deeper understanding of differences and nuances in language, for example nuances in the use of prepositions used both for differing circumstances, and within differing areas of the English language. As a student studying Chinese Mandarin, this is particularly relevant to a language spoken with varying dialects across multiple parts of China, alongside other parts of South East Asia. As a cohort of students, we would like to thank Dr Laura Bailey for delivering an inspiring and informative lecture on the topic.' -Joel H, Year 12



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LINGUISTICS WORKSHOP

'The linguistics talk given by Dr Laura Bailey was a phenomenal experience, of which a lot was learnt. This in particular, includes the development of the usage of the word "cheeky" in English culture and how it is more commonly used by the younger generations, and how Americans do not tend to use the work "cheeky" as a common adjective to most nouns. 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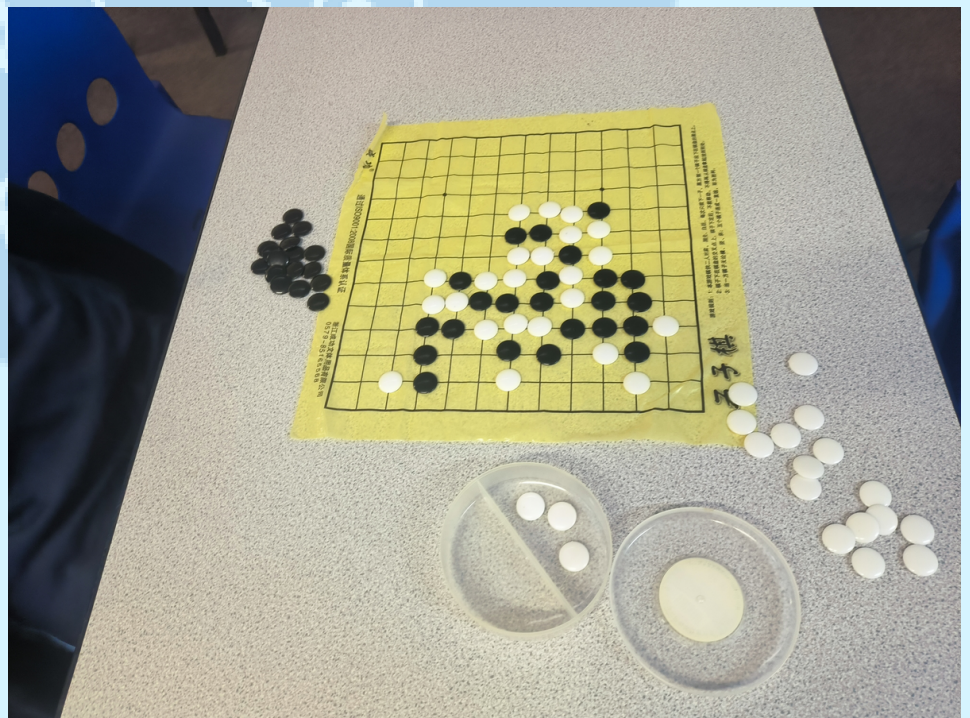
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KS3 CHINESE CLUB

Series snippet

200 million years ago there was supercontinent called Pangea, continental drift led to the formation of the 7 continents. This series of nature programmes takes a look at each of the continents. Each program highlights the diversity of the species and landscapes in each continent, it also focuses on the critical issues of climate change and how we are at a tipping point. It shows the extreme measures animals must take in order to survive in the newly changing climates.

The first episode is filmed in Antarctica, the most hostile continent on the planet. It shows the challenges facing animal, it follows Weddell Seals, humpbacked whales, king penguins, elephant seals and Albatross. The struggle for animals living on a continent where temperatures reach minus 40 in spring and 98% is covered in ice.

The second episode is based around Asia, the first scene is in Siberia. It shows the challenges animals face due to climate change. Polar bears are forced inland due to dwindling sea ice. There is a dramatic scene where polar bears are hunting walrus on the cliff edge. This creates chaos in the walrus ranks and many fall to the bottom of the cliff and die.

HOW WILL BANNING DISPOSABLE VAPES PROTECT CHILDREN'S HEALTH?

Disposable vapes will be banned in the UK as part of ambitious government plans to tackle the rise in youth vaping and protect children's health.

New laws are being created to restrict vape flavours, introduce plain packaging and change how vapes are displayed in shops so they don't appeal to children. The new law will make it illegal to sell tobacco products to anyone born on or after the 1st of January 2009, delivering on the Prime Minister's pledge to create a smoke-free generation.

Recent figures show the number of children using vapes in the past 3 years has tripled. Use among younger children is also rising, with 9% of 11 to 15-year-olds now using vapes. The long-term health impacts of vaping are unknown and the nicotine contained within them can be highly addictive, with withdrawal sometimes causing anxiety, trouble concentrating and headaches. While vaping can play a role in helping adult smokers to quit, children should never vape.

Disposable vapes have been a key driver behind the alarming rise in youth vaping, with the proportion of 11 to 17-year-old vapers using disposables increasing almost ninefold in the last 2 years.

To crack down on underage sales, the government will also bring in new fines for shops in England and Wales which sell vapes illegally to children. Trading standards officers will be empowered to act 'on the spot' to tackle underage tobacco and vape sales. This builds on a maximum £2,500 fine that local authorities can already impose.



JURGEN KLOPP ANNOUNCES LIVERPOOL RESIGNATION

On the 26th of January 2024, Jurgen Klopp, the extremely successful manager of Liverpool Football Club, released a statement that shocked football fans throughout the country, announcing he would step down as manager of Liverpool at the end of the 2023-2024 campaign, with the 56-year-old explaining in an interview released by the club, 'It is that I am running out of energy. I have no problem now, I knew it already for longer that I will have to announce it at one point, but I am absolutely fine now. I know that I cannot do the job again and again and again and again.'

His resignation will be a massive blow to the club, as since Klopp's appointment in October of 2015, the club have enjoyed arguably the greatest period of success in recent history, winning every possible domestic trophy in that time, as well as being crowned European and World Champions in 2019. With 3 months remaining of the 2023-2024 season, it is of yet unclear who may be Klopp's successor at Liverpool, although both fans and pundits have raised many theories as to who may be the next manager, the leading theory being that former Liverpool player from 2004-2009 and current manager of German side Bayer Leverkusen, Xabi Alonso may take up the role, considering the unlikely success of his team this season, who currently sit at the top of the German Bundesliga.

Klopp revealed to German podcaster Matthias Hietischer that following his departure he wishes to take a year out of football, in order to travel and experience football as a fan rather than a manager whilst he is able, although it is unsure after this if and when he will return, and if so who his next club may be, with many options being suggested, and, with England manager Gareth Southgate's position currently under scrutiny an England national team management position may become vacant at some point in the near future.

Klopp may leave in the summer, but he will still lead the club for the remainder of the season as they compete for trophies both in England and abroad, currently leading the Premier League table and with games upcoming in the knockout rounds of both the UEFA Europa League and the FA Cup, as well as competing in the final of the EFL League Cup against Chelsea FC on Sunday 28th of February. In these competitions, Liverpool fans, and indeed much of the footballing world will be hoping for Klopp to deliver a historic final trophy to the club before his departure, with Klopp himself stating, 'We are Liverpool, we went through harder things together. And you went through harder things before me. Let's make a strength of it. That would be really cool. Let's squeeze everything out of this season and have another thing to smile about when we look back in the future.'



A JOURNEY THROUGH CHEESE

Cheese has been a staple of the English diet for millennia. The origins of cheese can be traced back 7000 years through countless civilisations in the Fertile Crescent, a piece of land in Mesopotamia. It is thought that cheese was accidentally discovered when humans used animal stomachs to store milk in. These animal stomachs had 'rennet' - an enzyme involved in curdling milk. Thousands of years later, cheeses of all types are readily available in all supermarkets and corner shops in the world. It is hard to go a day without seeing or consuming cheese. But why is that? Firstly, it has all the good stuff like protein, calcium and vitamins but it also contains a wonder ingredient called 'Casein'. This substance can light up your brain's opioid receptors which leaves you feeling warm and satisfied.

Not least of the cheese-loving countries, England has created a variety of wonderful cheeses over its history. Perhaps one of the most famous is Stilton. The infamous blue cheese, loved by the old but hated by the young. Its iconic blue veins are produced by the use of a mould called *Penicillium Roqueforti*. Although this is mould and biodegrading, it is not harmful to humans. The pungent and robust flavour of Stilton was first invented by Frances Pawlett, a cheesemaker in Wymondham, Leicestershire in the 1720s. Due to its place of origin, Stilton can only be called Stilton if it is made in Derbyshire, Leicestershire or Nottinghamshire. It must be made from local and pasteurised milk, have a cylindrical shape and form its own crust.



Another example is Wensleydale, a crumbly white cheese. Its roots trace back to the 12th century when a group of French Cistercian monks settled in the Yorkshire area and began making cheese. However, the modern version we all know today was first manufactured in the 19th century. On one hand, Wensleydale is similar to Stilton, as to be called proper 'Yorkshire Stilton' it must be produced in the Wensleydale area. On the other hand, it has no other requirements and is widely manufactured in commercial factories all over Britain. Wensleydale is actually vegetarian as it uses 'microbial rennet' instead of the conventional 'animal rennet'. Well known to many, it is a prominent feature in the Wallace and Gromit series, with Wallace having a particular fondness for Wensleydale, similar to me!

However, there is a downside to cheese - it has high amounts of saturated fat and sodium. Excessive intake of saturated fat can lead to increased cholesterol levels. These levels increase when you get to the burger fast food cheeses that you get in your Big Mac. These are the absolute bottom of the cheese feudal pyramid - the peasants, with Cheddar, the King of Queso and Stilton at the top. Overall, cheese comes in many shapes and sizes, most of which are circular, but shape is no object to a true cheese enthusiast.



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SIXTH FORM BUILDING UPDATE

Works planned for the next period include the commencement of the structural SFS (Steel Framing System) to the facade. This is a component-supply facade system which consists of U & C shaped studs and tracks and is designed on a project specific basis to form the inner leaf of a facade. This type of system is far stronger than a standard metal frame system and can be used for the construction of load bearing walls.

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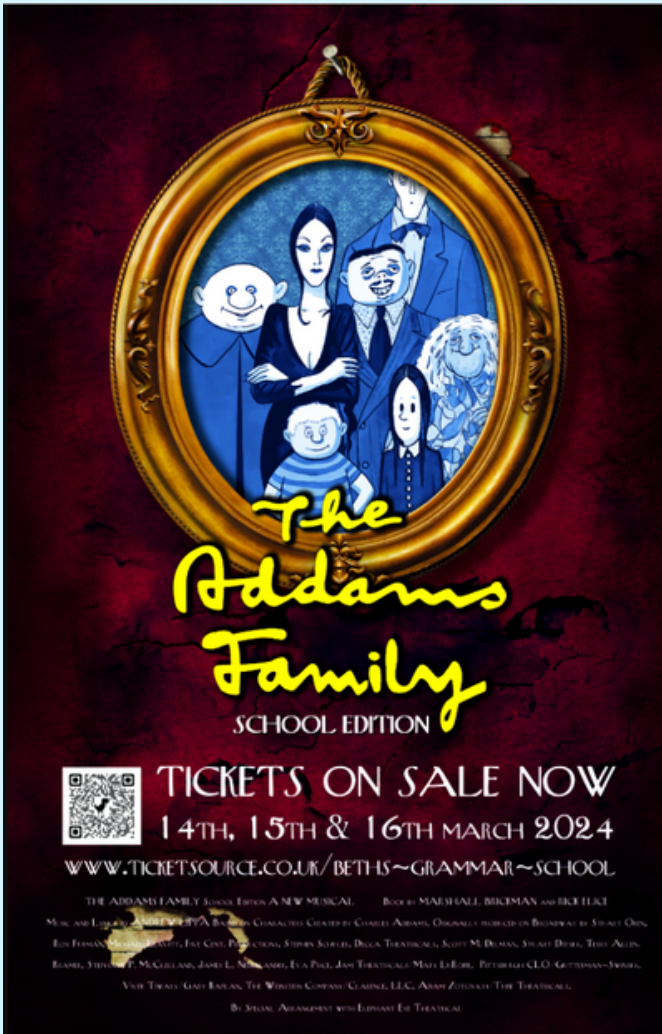

What Parents & Educators Need to Know about

TEKKEN 8

Thirty years after its debut on the original PlayStation, the Tekken franchise is back with its eighth mainstream instalment. A one-on-one fighting game series in the same vein as Street Fighter and Mortal Kombat, Tekken 8 can be commended for its relative lack of in-game purchases – but there's still plenty to consider in keeping young players safe from potential hazards.



WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

FUTURE SPENDING?

Tekken 8 carries a PEGI 16 rating, with the assessors noting its violence, occasional profanity and in-game purchase options. The latter issue, however, is a little different to what you may expect from a modern game: unlike many high-profile releases, Tekken 8's content is all accessible without spending any extra money. The exceptions are new characters, which will become available to purchase separately in the future.

COPYCAT RISK

With characters flying across the screen using a mixture of authentic and fantastical fighting styles, younger children and impressionable teens may find themselves tempted to copy their favourite characters or act out their epic fights in real life. This could simply amount to harmless fun – but could also easily lead to accidents, injury and distress if young gamers start actually landing blows.

VIOLENT GAMEPLAY

As a fighting game, Tekken 8's gameplay is heavily based on punching, kicking and throwing opponents around – while some characters' attacks occasionally involve weapons. Most of the violence is comparatively cartoonish in its execution and lacking in gore, but the fact remains that the action still revolves entirely around intense combat and inflicting damage on an opponent.

FAMILY CONFLICT

Tekken 8's story mode, 'The Dark Awakenings', focuses on two of the series' most important characters – Kazuya and Jin, a father and son who have been warring for years. The sight of two family members physically fighting each other may be hard to understand (and difficult to deal with) for some children – causing confusion and concern over why relatives would want to hurt one another.

RANKED ONLINE PLAY

Tekken 8 features an array of online modes – most notably its 'Ranked' section, where players battle to reach the top spot of a worldwide leaderboard. Many players will dedicate significant amounts of time to practising and – while the challenge can be fun – some of these matches can get extremely competitive. Children could become obsessed with climbing the rankings and dedicate an unhealthy amount of time to the game or grow angry if they wind up on a losing streak.

ONLINE CONTACT

Tekken 8 doesn't offer voice chat by default, but a player's platform ID is visible (such as their PlayStation Network ID, Steam account or Xbox gamertag). Rival players can, therefore, reach out via messages if they wish. Given the game's fiercely competitive nature, these communications can potentially put children at risk of online abuse if their opponent is a particularly sore loser.

Advice for Parents & Educators

TRY IT OUT YOURSELF

As with many popular games, we'd recommend checking it out for yourself in advance if you have any concerns. In the case of Tekken 8, there's a free demo version available (for all platforms) which lets you experience fights with a handful of the characters: a useful way of establishing first-hand whether some children might find the game's violence to be too intense.

EXERCISE YOUR JUDGEMENT

While Tekken 8 features a sort of 'spray' impact effect when attacks land, it's not the kind of game that most observers would describe as gory (unlike, for instance, the Mortal Kombat franchise). Of course, any fighting game worthy of the name will include a significant degree of violence – but the level at which the battles in Tekken are pitched may not be an issue for some children.

MARTIAL ARTS MOTIVATION?

With characters utilising real-world fighting styles such as jiu-jitsu, boxing and kickboxing, Tekken could represent an opportunity to channel a child's fondness for the game into a beneficial interest in real-world martial arts. Classes can help to build young people's confidence and physical fitness, as well as providing avenues for making new friends.

CONTROL COMMUNICATIONS

If a child plays Tekken online with anyone apart from their friends, then parents and carers could consider restricting communications – such as shutting off the facility to be messaged by other players (although the child's profile name will still be displayed) – to reduce the chance of contact from strangers. This can be done via the console's account settings or through the child's Steam account (if playing on PC).

Meet Our Expert
