## MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER








### CAREERS

This week is National Apprenticeship Week, and the careers team has encouraged all year groups to think about apprenticeships, using specifically designed PowerPoints for all key stages in form time. As well as information about different types of apprenticeships, the presentations also included videos and a quiz.



We also spoke with two apprentices who work at our school – Mr Buckingham, who works within the Network team and is currently studying for a degree apprenticeship in digital and technology solutions, and Mr McDonald, who works in the finance department, and completed his level 3 apprenticeship in business administration a couple of years ago.







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### CAREERS

As part of National Apprenticeship Week we also welcomed back a former student, Victor Adegbesan, who is doing a Level 6 Degree apprenticeship in software engineering at JP Morgan and studying at Queen Mary's University London. In our most successful Sixth Form event so far, Victor spoke with the students and explained why he chose an apprenticeship rather than a place at the London School of Economics to study data science.

Victor was the second of our alumni to support our careers programme this term. In January Oxford doctoral graduate Ciaran Gilbride spoke to students about his experience as a member of the team which developed the Oxford AstraZeneca vaccine, as well as giving insights into the realities of studying at Oxford.

In January we welcomed Marion Childs to the Careers Team as our new Work Experience Administrator. She is currently busy working on the optional Year 12 work experience scheme with our partner, EBP Kent, as well as supporting the current Year 10 students who will be going on work experience in October, soon after they start Year 11.
