We held our online Sixth Form Open Evening on Thursday 11th November 2021 for our Year 11 students. We appreciate the experience is not the same as coming into school, but were pleased to have many parents join our event. This will include our promotional video, our Sixth Form Prospectus, our Sixth Form Options Booklet and details on how to apply. Our students will receive the same information once they return from the Trial Examinations. We are also planning to run bookable tours for external students from the end of November until the end of January which is the deadline for applications.

Our Sixth Form Further Mathematicians entered the online version of the UK Senior Mathematics Challenge. It is a multiple choice paper of 25 questions set over 90 minutes, which awards marks for correct answers and subtracts marks for incorrect ones. Questions not attempted do not affect the total. The type of questions set are not necessarily part of the GCSE or A Level syllabus but are challenging. I spoke to one of the groups afterwards and they said that they had enjoyed the competition and the experience. We look forward to receiving the results in the coming weeks.

THE IMPORTANCE OF DIWALI

When is Diwali?

Diwali follows the Hindu lunar calendar and its date changes annually it's celebrated on a moonless night in October or November. This year Diwali was celebrated on Thursday 4th November.

Why is Diwali celebrated?

Every region in India has different traditions for celebrating this festival, but there is agreement that Diwali represents the triumph of good over evil, light over darkness and wisdom over ignorance. This is linked to the ancient legend of Lord Rama, who was deprived of his kingdom and sent into exile for 14 years. Diwali celebrates Rama's eventual defeat of the evil spirit Ravana, and his triumphant return to his home.

How is Diwali celebrated?

The weeks leading up to Diwali are traditionally a time for redecorating the home, buying new clothes and jewellery, and exchanging gifts such as sweetmeats, dried fruits and nuts. This is the season for dinner parties, outdoor food festivals and craft fairs, all of which help build up excitement ahead of the main Diwali celebration.

What food is eaten during Diwali?

Each region has its favourite dishes, most are vegetarian but in some households, there will be a presence of meat.

Savoury snacks could include samosas, bhajis, aloo tikki (griddle-cooked potato patties) and channa bhatura (spiced chickpeas and puffed bread). There are very different types of the main meal, which may feature meaty curries or a wide variety of vegetarian Indian dishes, including dhals and pulses. But the most important of them all is, sweetmeats ('mithai') these are the best part of the food of Diwali. They're made with dairy products, which has religious significance and are offered to both gods and guests.





SCHOOL LOCKER RENTALS

Currently, the school works in partnership with a company to provide your child with the opportunity to rent a locker. The cost of hire is £22 per academic year (12p per day if hired at the start of the school year), and the arrangement is formed between the company and the parent/carer. Payment is made online, directly to the company. The lockers are large and will hold a number of heavy and cumbersome items. They are extremely robust and are secured with a digital lock to remove the risk of losing keys.

In the past, the scheme has been very successful however, this year the number of rentals has dropped considerably. We have been advised by the company that if numbers remain at this level, it will not be financially viable to continue with the current arrangement. This will result in the removal of the lockers from the school site.

Should you wish for your son to continue to be provided with the opportunity to store equipment safely on site, and not have to carry a heavy bag around all day, I would urge you to investigate the locker scheme.
