






# LGBTQ+ HISTORY MONTH




# NATIONAL CAREERS WEEK, 6TH- 11TH MARCH

The winning form was Form 8A. Their letter was D and they came up with an impressive 418 entries including Deck Engineer, Diver, Dry Kiln Operator, Dice Maker and Dermatologist. However, that's not the whole story. This incredible effort was actually the work of just one student, Kesavan S, who was given an Amazon voucher for his hard work.

In second place was form 7W who thought of 254 careers beginning with W (including a lot that happen in a warehouse), and in third place was form 7B with 245 job titles beginning with B. Because these forms had worked so hard each were given an edible prize!

There was also a House Points competition and each House was awarded the equivalent number of points from across all three year groups.



Some of the Year 11 Careers Prefects worked with the Careers Team to produce an assembly for Key Stage 4. One prefect researched highest paid jobs, another careers linked to Biology and Chemistry (including Research analyst and Forensic Science technician) and another his aspirations on becoming an actuary.




