MY DREAMS AND MY MODEL ROCKET BY ABIODUN 9W

I hope to one day work on rockets that get people to other planets and moons. And it is for this very reason that I began building model rockets and trying to learn more about space travel and how rockets are made and produced. Recently, I built a model rocket that will fly approximately 55 meters high. This model rocket weighs 450 grams and is about 1 meter tall, it will be powered by an Estes D12-3 meaning that it has a max thrust of 3.3 kg. The Estes D12-3 is in the D class of rocket motors the '3' part is the delay between motor burning out and the ignition of the parachute deployment charge.

MY DREAMS AND MY MODEL ROCKET BY ABIODUN 9W

The reason I have not yet flown this model rocket is because model rocketry in the UK is exceedingly difficult. Firstly, the highest class of rocket motors that you can buy is D class which at max is limited to a total impulse (newtons / seconds) of 20. You can buy rocket motors more powerful than this, but you must go to an actual launch site to buy one. Model rocket motors can go up to G class, a max impulse of 160. After this you must get certification and do tests to access higher classes of rocket motors, which does beyond Z class all the way to AJ class (a max impulse of 1930000000).

PSHCE FOR YEARS 7, 8, 9 AND 10


Katie Kelleher

Year 9 also had the opportunity to attend a talk given by Katie Kelleher, who is one of a few female crane operators in the UK. She gave the students an insight to her career path that led her to construction. Having studied English Literature at university, and then working in sales for ten years, she started as the first female on the Lifting Technician apprenticeship with Select / Laing O'Rourke, operating Tower cranes, Mobile Cranes, Crawler Cranes, Pedestrian cranes. She's a STEM Ambassador, has taken part in parliamentary committees on apprenticeships, and have appeared on London Live, BBC breakfast, BBC 100 Women season, the Metro and Stylist magazine. She's worked on big infrastructure projects including Crossrail, and is currently working on the Tideway project.












