MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER



We are moving into the middle section of the term and our students are working hard. One of the classes I teach have been doing examinations this week and I have been marking their papers using official examination mark schemes. I thought I would take a little time to explain how a Mathematics paper is assessed.

For a start, it isn't just 'tick and cross' as many sarcastically hint at. The mark scheme consists of Method (M) marks, Answer (A) marks and if you see in the main answer (B) marks. The instruction is always that an A mark cannot be awarded without an M mark being given first, so it is possible to award M1 A0 but not M0 A1. An example is given below with additional comments by the exam board and alternative approaches.

This is not a "show that" question.

Note: Watch out for an answer of $\frac{2}{x+3}$ probably scored from
$$\frac{4x - 2(x-3)}{(x+3)(x-3)} = \frac{2x - 6}{(x+3)(x-3)} = \frac{2(x-3)}{(x+3)(x-3)}$$

This would score B1 M1 A0 A0



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The B1 mark is independent of the others so it is awarded or it isn't. However, the remaining three marks are dependent on the M1 being awarded. An incorrect method loses all three marks. So methodology and showing your working are very important because a correct method with incorrect working would gain one mark. This is before we have "follow through" answer marks where an incorrect answer earlier is used further on in the calculation correctly.

Whilst I don't necessarily enjoy marking, I am very interested in what each of my student scores, what they are able to do what they are yet to perfect, and whether there are any trends in topics that have been done well or are in need of revisiting. The second paper my students will do is next week and I wish them well.

It is my turn to present the on-line Assemblies this week. My theme is Days of the Week and students will be encouraged to discuss further the topical subjects introduced. On the PowerPoint, I note that Tuesday 23rd November is Dr Who Day and Wednesday 24th November is Evolution Day, celebrating the publication of Charles Darwin's "On the Origin of Species." Thursday 25th November discusses the Elimination of Violence Against Women Day which is as poignant today as ever and needs to be called out; Friday 26th November is Anti-Obesity Day and Sunday 28th November is the beginning of both Advent and Hanukkah. I think the topics to discuss are quite varied and I have encouraged Form Tutors to deepen and widen their groups understanding of the facts surrounding the nomination of such days.

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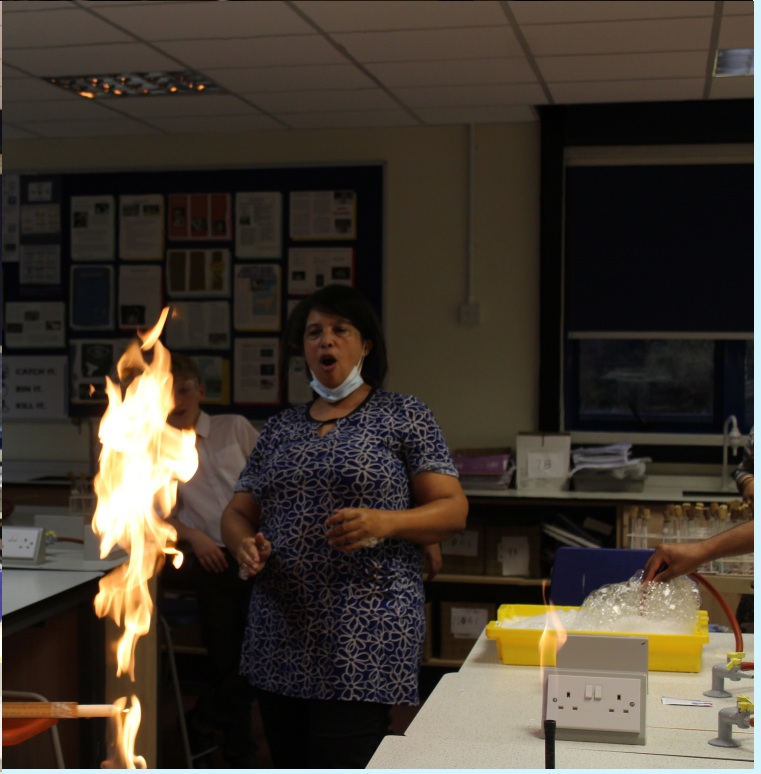
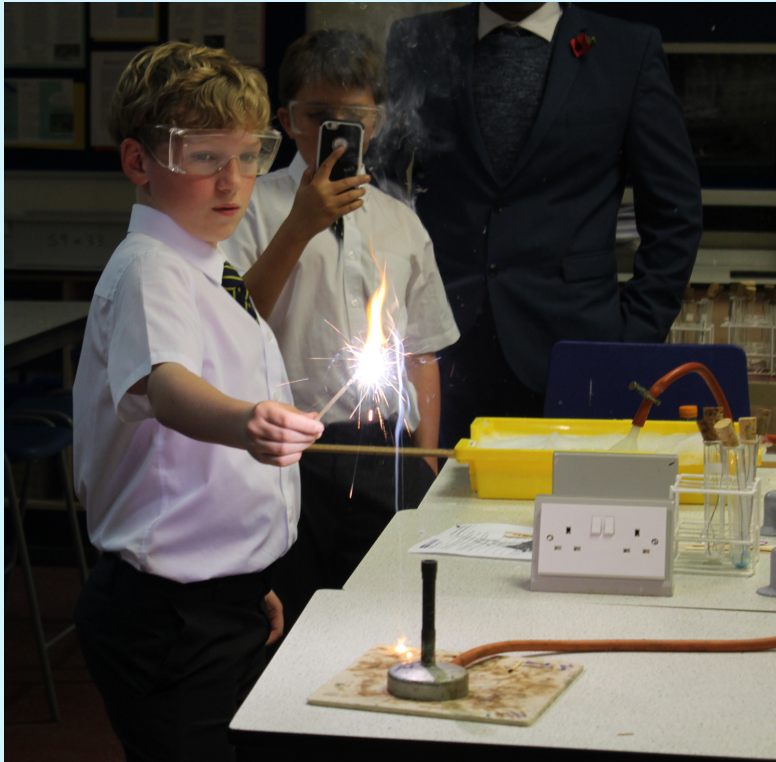
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YEAR 7 STEM CLUB

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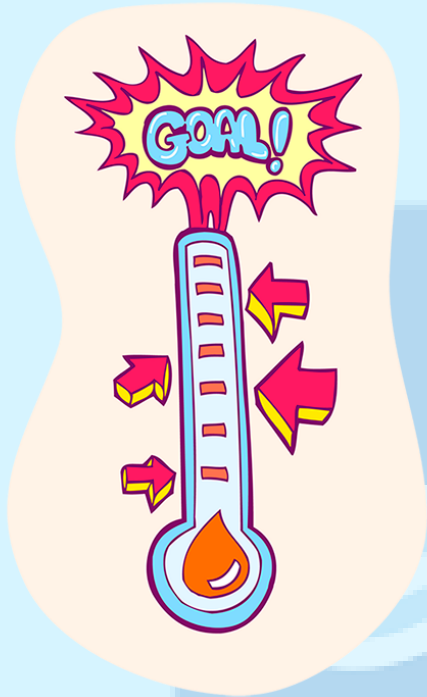
