The purpose is to reconnect with nature and to focus on your world. Over the last 6 years, it has taken place, researchers have found 274 cases where earth hour has been effective, all be it by a low amount; it is getting consistently better every year, though, as more and more people are participating.

Every hour we consume 18TWh; to put that into perspective, 1TWh is equivalent to burning 10.8 million barrels of oil. This is why we all MUST turn our devices off on Saturday, March 25 8:30 – 9:30 pm

#### **1st XI v Sevenoaks School**

As the 2nd XI lifted their trophy, the 1st team began their warm-up with the pressure on to go and do the double – back to back Kent trophies!

Beths started the game well controlling possession and creating some early chances, forcing some good defending from Sevenoaks School. With a good switch of play from Alex N in goal, Adam W found himself in a 1 v 1 down the right-hand side, and after getting past his defender was brought down which was followed by appeals for a penalty kick, however a corner ball was awarded. Despite not converting any of our chances, Beths were the better side 15 minutes in and looked strong. However, with a long goal kick and a good flick on by the centre forward, the Sevenoaks winger was through on goal but was fouled by Oliver W; penalty kick to Sevenoaks with no arguments from the Beths players.

The Sevenoaks player stepped up and struck the ball well, however Alex N guessed the right way and stayed big, saving the penalty with his trailing leg – a huge cheer from the spectators uplifted Beths, who suddenly realised this wasn't going to be an easy task.



Beths increased the intensity and began to win the ball back very quickly in transitions, with some excellent work rate from Aaron A in the middle. As we approached half time Beths continued to pile on the pressure and with a good delivery from Sam J on the left, Max C forced a brilliant save from the Sevenoaks goalkeeper who palmed it out for a corner. Sam then took the corner as Bradley M made a fantastic run to the front post area, and with a glancing header he guided the ball into the bottom left corner. A well-deserved 1-0 lead going into the half time break.

With just a 1 goal advantage, Beths knew going into the second half that they still had a lot to do, and that getting the next goal in the game was crucial. Chris A made way for Arinze C who had an instant impact on the game, and within minutes of kicking off a perfectly flighted ball over the top from Dapo F allowed Arinze to slide the ball into the bottom right-hand corner. This goal was closely followed by a third, where a defending error from the Sevenoaks centre back put Sam Jarvis through on goal, who lifted the ball over the defenders head before volleying the ball into the back of the net. 3-0 Beths with half an hour left.









As Beths began to manage the game well keeping the ball and playing in the right areas, Beths looked for a fourth with some great link-up play between Femi A and Kofi B. With 10 minutes left the title was secured, as Zach G delivered a lofted corner to the back post which was met by Chris Adjei to finish it confidently.

On the final whistle there was an elated cheer from all of the players, who after 7 years had finally won their first Kent Cup Trophy. The boys were awarded their medals and the celebrations began (and continued the whole way home on the coach!). It was a fantastic performance from everyone in the team, with captain Jack B and Oliver W keeping a well-deserved clean sheet. A fantastic end to school football for the team who completed the League Cup double. Overall it was a brilliant day, and both the 1st and 2nd team did Beths proud!
















### **SCIENCE WEEK**


