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# STUDENT SUCCESS

## London Youth Games - By Charlie , 9A

This year the London Youth Games Tennis had more entries so we played a Qualifying Day in May at Redbridge Sports Centre. I was really proud to be selected as the Junior Boy for Bexley once again and our team were fantastic, beating Hackney, Haringey and Islington to top our qualifying group.

On 18th June we returned to Redbridge for the Finals Day with the top eight teams competing for the medals. On arrival we were told it would be three knockout rounds which added a bit of pressure as we'd previously been told it would be a round robin qualifier group in the morning.

We headed on to court against Redbridge, last year's silver medalists, and won all four matches sending us in to the semifinals. This was probably going to be our toughest test yet as we knew we now had to play Bromley who have always done well in this tournament.

The senior girl and I played first, both winning and giving our teammates a bit of a cushion. One win from the next two matches was enough to send us into the finals and we got it.

The final against Havering, last years gold medalists, was tough. I had to play a boy who beat me last year in a really close match but, this year, I got the win. Again, it went down to the last two matches with us having a 2-0 lead and we won 3-1... Bexley had gone from bronze medalists last year to bringing home the gold this year!

Our medals and trophy were presented by the Chief Executive of London Youth Games with Havering and Bromley in silver and bronze places respectively. It was a real achievement to be able to bring the trophy back to Bexley for the first time since 1998!

Thanks to Beths for supporting my training for this again as well as my ongoing training. I'm proud to be able to represent Bexley due to being a pupil at Beths and hope to do so again in future years.



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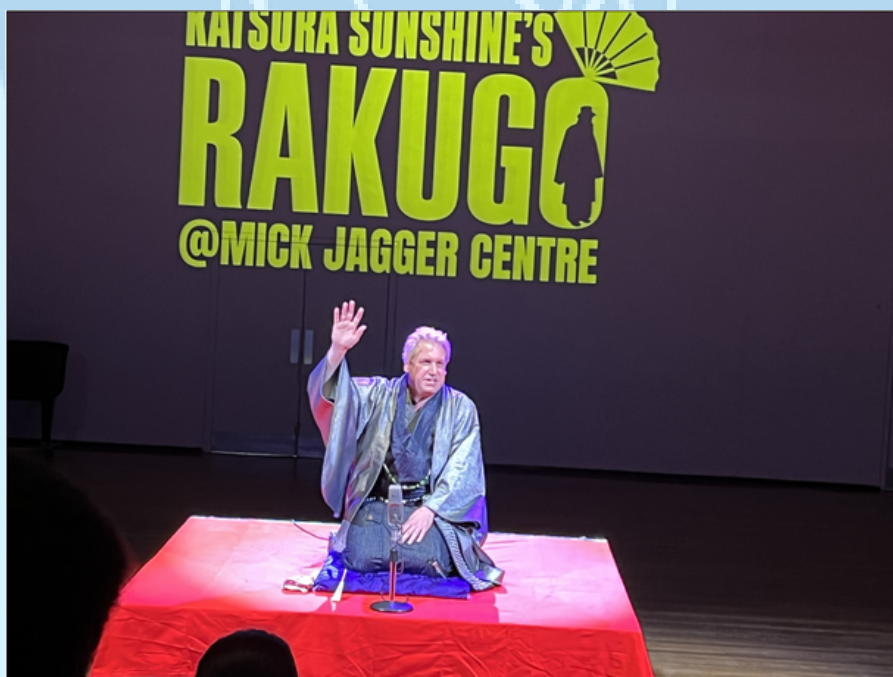


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# MFL JAPANESE TRIP

On 21st June, Year 7 and Year 9 Japanese student had the opportunity to watch a Japanese theatre performance by renowned 'Rakugo' storyteller: Katsura Sunshine. Originally from Canada, Katsura Sunshine lived in Japan for 22 years and studied the art of Rakugo from a master storyteller before embarking on his world-wide career. They were enthralled by the comical stories told in the traditional Japanese style of 'Rakugo'. He is currently performing at Leicester Square Theatre and on Broadway in New York, and gave a special performance for one night only at Dartford Grammar School! So, it was a real treat for our Japanese students to see this performance in action. 'Rakugo' is a traditional form of storytelling, involving humorous monologues – delivered in English with Japanese cultural references. The students also had a opportunity to ask questions following the performance and it was a pleasure to see how engaged they were in finding out more about this ancient Japanese art form.

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# SPORTS DAY

It was a glorious day for Sports Day 2022 as the year 7 & 8 students began to arrive in their numbers. As the staff and Senior Prefects got set up for the day, the students began their mass warm up led by Ms Ewing, which, if not already, got their blood flowing for an exciting day ahead.

The events kicked off at around 9.30am with the year 8's starting in the field, and year 7's on the track. Following an announcement from Mr Hayman, the students made their way to their events with the cheering and encouragement from their forms behind them. Despite the heat, everyone showed a great enthusiasm and energy, which really made for a fantastic atmosphere for the day.

On the track Derek O 7E and Kyros O 8E won their respectable 100m races in outstanding times, with Sean M 7C and Harvey O 8H winning the 200m. With the continued support of the crowd, Ethan D 7E and Daniel F 8H ran brilliantly in the 800m, which were then followed by Ollie A 7C and Leo 8W in the 1500m. As the temperature continued to rise it did make the long distance events challenging, however it was great to see Jack B and the Senior Prefects run alongside the participants for some additional encouragement.

Some noteworthy performances in the throws were Ethan S in 8W winning the year 7 Discus, and Josh T 7A and Raynon R 8H in the Shotput. It was a dominant performance from Brampton in the High Jump, with Fegor A 7B and Oscar E-L 8B both coming out on top, showcasing some excellent Fosbury Flop techniques.

It was a clean sweep for Cray in the Tug of War finals winning both the year 7 and year 8 competitions, and as the morning drew to an end, Eardley finished on a high winning both 4x100m competitions, putting on an excellent display.

Once the results had been announced and year 7 and 8 had departed, it was quickly time for the year 9 and year 10 competitions to begin. Following several complaints, Mr Beaney had now taken over on the microphone duty, and began directing students towards their first events.

With some brilliant performances and sportsmanship shown, we had Zadaine 9W and David O 10W winning their 100m races, and Jacob 9B and Osbourn 10C winning the 200m. Meanwhile in the field David 9E and Ola 10W were triumphant in the Shotput, adding to their House totals. It was a double for Brampton as Chinaemere in 9B and Aidan 10B won the High Jump with some outstanding jumps, reaching over 1.60m. In the long distance events, Aidan 9W and Alex 10W were successful in the 800m, with Max 9B and Michael 10E winning the 1500m.

The penultimate event of the day was the Tug of War, which saw Eardley winning both the year 9 and year 10 competitions. Finally, we had reached the 4x100m relays, of which everyone was visibly excited for, knowing this could be the deciding event. As they set off and came round the final bend it looked extremely close, with Cray edging it in the final 100m in both races; a thrilling end to what was a fantastic day.

Whilst the final scores were being calculated, it was then time for the annual Staff v Sixth Form Tug of War event. The Sixth Form had a good start, however, despite having more people, the Staff quickly showed their experience and eased over the line, giving us another year of bragging rights. Once the scores had been finalised, Mr Beaney then addressed all of the students to announce the overall winners. In ascending order, it was confirmed that Wickham were the winners of Sports Day 2022, which was followed by a loud cheer and celebration by the Wickham cohort. What children need to know about

## ONLINE BULLYING



### What is online bullying?

ONLINE BULLYING – ALSO KNOWN AS CYBERBULLYING – IS BULLYING THAT TAKES PLACE ON THE INTERNET OR VIA ELECTRONIC DEVICES AND MOBILE PHONES. IT CAN INCLUDE:

1. SENDING SOMEONE MEAN OR THREATENING EMAILS, DIRECT MESSAGES OR TEXT MESSAGES
2. HACKING INTO SOMEONE'S ONLINE ACCOUNT
3. BEING RUDE OR MEAN TO SOMEONE WHEN PLAYING ONLINE GAMES
4. POSTING PRIVATE OR EMBARRASSING PHOTOS ONLINE OR SENDING THEM TO OTHERS
5. CREATING FAKE SOCIAL MEDIA ACCOUNTS THAT MOCK SOMEONE OR TRICK THEM
6. EXCLUDING SOMEONE FROM AN ONLINE CONVERSATION OR BLOCKING THEM FOR NO REASON

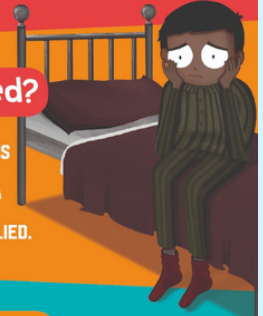


### Why does it happen?

GOING ONLINE MAKES IT EASIER FOR PEOPLE TO SAY AND DO THINGS THEY PROBABLY WOULDN'T DO FACE TO FACE. ONLINE BULLIES DON'T GET TO SEE THEIR VICTIMS' REACTIONS IN REAL LIFE, SO THIS CAN COCOON THEM FROM THE REAL DAMAGE THAT THEY ARE DOING. QUITE OFTEN, PEOPLE BULLY BECAUSE THEY ARE GOING THROUGH SOMETHING DIFFICULT THEMSELVES AND TAKING IT OUT ON OTHERS IS THE ONLY WAY THEY KNOW HOW TO GET CONTROL OF THEIR OWN EMOTIONS.

### How does it feel to be bullied?

BEING BULLIED CAN IMPACT ON YOUR SELF-ESTEEM, CONFIDENCE AND SOCIAL SKILLS. BECAUSE IT HAPPENS ON YOUR PHONE, TABLET OR COMPUTER, IT CAN FEEL LIKE YOU ARE UNDER THREAT EVEN WHEN YOU'RE IN A SAFE ENVIRONMENT, SUCH AS YOUR BEDROOM. DON'T FORGET...IT IS NOT YOUR FAULT IF YOU'RE BEING BULLIED.



### Am I an online bully?

SOMETIMES IT ISN'T OBVIOUS THAT WHAT YOU ARE DOING IS WRONG, BUT IF YOU USE DIGITAL TECHNOLOGY TO UPSET, ANGER OR EMBARRASS SOMEONE ON PURPOSE, THIS MEANS YOU'RE INVOLVED IN ONLINE BULLYING. IT MIGHT BE AS SIMPLE AS 'LIKING' A MEAN POST, LAUGHING AT AN ONLINE VIDEO, OR SPREADING A RUMOUR, BUT THE PERSON BEING BULLIED COULD FEEL LIKE THEY ARE BEING GANGED UP ON. THINK ABOUT HOW IT WOULD MAKE YOU FEEL IF IT HAPPENED TO YOU. EVERYONE CAN MAKE MISTAKES, BUT IT'S IMPORTANT TO LEARN FROM THEM – GO BACK AND DELETE ANY UPSETTING OR NASTY POSTS, TWEETS OR COMMENTS YOU'VE WRITTEN.



### Who do I tell?

YOU DON'T HAVE TO DEAL WITH THE BULLYING ON YOUR OWN. TALK TO AN ADULT THAT YOU TRUST – A PARENT, GUARDIAN, OR TEACHER. MOST WEBSITES, SOCIAL MEDIA WEBSITES AND ONLINE GAMES OR MOBILE APPS LET YOU REPORT AND BLOCK PEOPLE WHO ARE BOTHERING YOU. YOU COULD ALSO CONTACT CHILDLINE (WWW.CHILDLINE.ORG.UK), WHERE A TRAINED COUNSELLOR WILL LISTEN TO ANYTHING THAT'S WORRYING YOU – YOU DON'T EVEN HAVE TO GIVE YOUR NAME.



### How do I prove it?

WHEN CYBERBULLYING HAPPENS, IT IS IMPORTANT TO DOCUMENT AND REPORT THE BEHAVIOUR, SO IT CAN BE ADDRESSED – RECORD THE DATES AND TIMES WHEN CYBERBULLYING HAS OCCURRED, AND SAVE AND PRINT SCREENSHOTS, EMAILS, AND TEXT MESSAGES.



### How can I stay safe?

MAKE SURE YOUR PRIVACY SETTINGS ARE SET SO THAT ONLY PEOPLE YOU KNOW AND TRUST CAN SEE WHAT YOU POST. NEVER GIVE OUT PERSONAL INFORMATION ONLINE, SUCH AS IN PUBLIC PROFILES, CHAT ROOMS OR BLOGS, AND AVOID FURTHER COMMUNICATION WITH THOSE SENDING THE MESSAGES. KEEP AWARE OF FAKE PROFILES AND INTERNET USERS PRETENDING TO BE SOMEONE THAT THEY ARE NOT.
