1	Watch a German film (at a school event or on Netflix) and write a 200 word review of it in German – what it’s about, what you liked and disliked and why, and whether you would recommend it to a friend.	Choose a festival in Germany, Switzerland or Austria that you find interesting and write up a fact-file about them in German.	Change the language of your phone / tablet / games console to German or play your favourite video game with the language in German. You must provide evidence over time.	Find out about a tradition or celebration in the German-speaking world and come up with a plan for how we could celebrate it in school.
2	Find someone who speaks German and record a 5 minute interview with them. Find out what they like doing in their free time, ask about their family and what their favourite subject was at school.	Research German-speaking communities around the world – Namibia, Paraguay, Brazil, USA. Write up a one-page report in German.	Find a German-speaking YouTuber or TikToker who interests you. Create a presentation to introduce them to your German class.	Support in the planning and delivery of KS3 German club consistently for six weeks.
3	Cook a traditional dish from the German-speaking world and bring in the food or photos of it. Write a 200 word review of the meal.	Imagine that you are going on holiday to somewhere in the German-speaking world and you have unlimited money. Research where you would go and what you would do, then write out your itinerary in German.	Deliver a 3 minute news presentation in German about a current issue in the German-speaking world. This could be recorded as a video or presented in person.	Attend a German trip or take part in an in-school German event.
4	Write a short fairy tale or children’s story in German.	Read a short novel in German (you can borrow one from the MFL library) and write a 200 word report on it in German. Include a brief synopsis, what you liked and disliked and why, whether you would recommend it to a friend and a list of new words you learnt from reading it.	Deliver a 5 minute instructional tutorial (as a recorded video or in person) teaching one of the following grammar points in German: the passive, the past perfect	Visit the library at the Goethe Institute in London - it’s free! - and provide photo evidence showing that you were there and what you read. They have books, magazines, DVDs, graphic novels and newspapers in German.
