1	Watch a documentary or film about the Classical world and write a 100 word review – what was it about, did you like it and what did you learn? 2	Create a poster of a mythical creature or land. Annotate with key details and facts. Create a Kahoot for your class to play on a grammar point or Classical Civilisation topic. Aim for 10 questions. Share with your class teacher.	Assist with Year 7 Latin Forum.
3	Read the English translation of a Latin poem or story and write your own poem or story either in the style of the author or in response to the poem.	Research a Roman historical figure (e.g. a poet, political leader or philosopher) and create a fact file on PPT for display or to present in class.	Record a 3 minute video presentation about an aspect of Classical Civilisation that interests you.	Attend a Latin trip or take part in an in-school Latin event and write a report.
4	Write a short story in Latin about a day in the life of Caecilius (aim for 40-50 words).	Read a news article on an archaeological dig and write up a summary of the news story.	Deliver a 5 minute instructional tutorial (alone or in a group) teaching a grammar point in Latin. This could be recorded as a video or presented in person.	Go to a museum exhibition/archaeological site related to Classics and take photos as evidence.
