WORK EXPERIENCE

Work experience for our year 11 students is a great opportunity to try out an area of work within a career the students may want to pursue. For some, at the end of the week the work experience will have reinforced their career aspirations. For others, the experience could discount that career path, which can be equally as useful. For most students though, it is more than that. It is also an opportunity to develop transferrable skills that will benefit the students in their future careers, whichever path they decide to take.

Over 190 students attended in-person work experience placement during the designated work experience week of 6th to 10th October. We are very grateful to all employers who gave their time and resources in providing such a valuable experience to our students.

Students attended a wide range of work places including architects, pharmacies, dental practices, law, finance, accounting and engineering firms. Placements also included Greater London Authority, Crystal Palace Football Club, Transport for London, Royal Society of the Arts, Bank of America and Deutsche Bank.

Three students experienced life at Imperial College London. Arvin completed a work project with the Design Engineering team, and Kareem worked with a post-doctoral research associate in the Data and Maths Team. Manolis joined a group of researchers, engineers, technicians and students in a fluid mechanics laboratory, doing activities related to aircraft stability, flow visualisation, and flight simulation in their wind tunnel.

At Queen Mary's, University of London, levan did clinical research, and the employer was full of praise: "He showed an excellent behaviour for learning and was a great team player, always carrying out the tasks he was assigned diligently." Aidan also completed a placement at Queen Mary's which included understanding technical skills related to the public sector, understanding of science & engineering career pathways, specific industry insights, as well as transferable skills like communication, teamwork, problem-solving, and time management.

Kaedyn worked with the department of Biomedical Engineering at University College London and Gabriel, worked with the Forecasting and Planning Team at the London Ambulance Service.

One student, Thom, worked at the art'otel in the newly regenerated Battersea Power Station complex.

I hope that O enjoyed his week with us and if there is anything that we can do to help him in the future for him not to hesitate to contact us as we would be more than happy to help. O's politeness and professionalism is an absolute credit to himself and your school and hopefully he is credited as a model student.

He is well mannered, professional, approachable and he will do well in any job sector. There were several comments about his maturity and outgoing friendly personality from finance staff. He showed an excellent behaviour for learning and was a great team player, always carrying out the tasks he was assigned diligently.

This rigorous, technical mindset, the ability to translate design intent into measurable, buildable solutions, is an outstanding skill to develop further. We were also positively surprised with his attitude, the student was always showing up before the agreed time, consistently showed gratitude, and maintained a very professional manner throughout the placement.

Students were asked to describe one thing that they learnt through doing the placement:

- . . in order to effectively control and maintain the administration and operations of a business requires great organisation as well as problem-solving skills.
- ... people aren't always worried what you're doing and just expect results. Unlike school the way you reach the solution of a problem doesn't have to be in line with a certain format.
- ... at work, they just expect you to get on with your task(s) without asking many questions.
- ... having a job requires high levels of independency and maturity, you do most things by yourself and have to stay focused at all times.
- ... how to be self-sufficient and learn about new things related to construction (RC Frames, Slipforms, Health and Safety etc.)







POSITIVE FEEDBACK FROM STUDENTS

We also asked students how doing the placement impacted on their plans for the future:

I am planning to return to Livicode for more work experience at a later date and hopefully get a job in either their company or in a similar job.

It opened a few windows as it showed what it truly meant to have a business. I believe it showed me that I would like to my own business, because, although it is quite time demanding and requires pin-point organisation, I believe it allows for a bit more freedom at the workplace rather than being told when and where to be.

I am potentially considering real estate as a career path to pursue, though I will research this in greater detail.

I would now prefer to help out or work at smaller businesses in the industry rather than the giants as many of these smaller businesses are struggling in this day and age.

This placement has reinforced my aspiration of pursuing a career in law in the future.

I would say that it has consolidated my passion in pursuing a career in science, thus I intend to work in the field of physics in the future.

I'd like to think that I now have a secure overview of how a private investment bank works and how they fit into the wider world of finance. Meeting every team in the firm gave me an idea of the various routes I could take into finance and if it's something I could see myself doing.

It definitely showed me an option of jobs I could do in the future, considering how much I enjoyed it all. There wasn't one moment that I found boring.

Our Y9 & Y10 Mandarin scholars had the privilege to explore the Jesus College of University of Cambridge, from the stunning canteen to the oldest Chapel and gorgeous gardens. On our walk to Fitzwilliam museum, students passed by the renowned Corpus clock, amazed by its delicate, classic yet modern design and the deep symbolic meaning behind it. Then off to the Fitzwilliam Museum for a deep dive into Chinese art — we were impressed by the beautiful ceramics on display! - Staff Feedback

This week, students from year 9 and 10 got to go on a trip to Cambridge where we visited Jesus College and were given the chance to see the chapel court along with various other remarkable locations in the college. Then, we visited Fitzwilliam Museum where we observed a variety of artefacts, paintings and sculptures from China, Japan and Europe. Overall, it was an amazing trip that our Mandarin students were able to go on, and it was a brilliant opportunity to expand our knowledge on Chinese history and culture.

On Tuesday, we went to the city of Cambridge Academic Heritage: Jesus College. When we arrived, we began with a visit to Jesus College, part of the university. We specifically toured the chapel, its foundations date back to 1200s, signifying that the structure is approximately 800 years old. The architecture was very impressive. Cultural Exploration: Fitzwilliam Museum. Then, we went ahead to the Fitzwilliam Museum. Our main aim was to view the collection of Chinese artefacts, which are in Gallery 26 and 28. I was impressed by the ceramic plate and pots. The detailed craftsmanship was amazing, showing a high level of skill in their creation. After this, we had lunch at the museum lunchroom and headed back to school.


