ECOBYTES

Beginning this week, **COP 30** (Conference of parties) is taking place in Belem, Brazil – located on the fringes of the Amazon. Organised by the United Nations, 193 countries are in attendance with the notable exception of the USA.

COP 30 is a 2-week event running from the 10th– 21st November. The main focus of COP 30 is to hold discussions regarding climate change, donating and raising money and making pledges to reduce greenhouse gas emissions.

The noteworthy missing party from this year's COP 30 – the USA - sent 0 delegates, under the provision of the incumbent president Donald Trump who is a known climate change sceptic, with a capitalistic agenda focused on the exporting of US-sourced fossil fuels.

Today also marks **10** years of the Paris agreement which aimed to keep average global temperatures to below **1.5°C** above pre-industrial levels. The success of this pledge is to be debated, as in 2024, the yearly average temperature limit has been breached. Furthermore, 2025 is projected to be the hottest year on record.

In recent events, many protests by individuals representing the indigenous population of Amazonia were present surrounding the venue used for COP 30. One indigenous protester has gone on record to remark "We can't eat money." Referencing the prevalent issue of large-scale deforestation, cattle ranching, mineral and oil extraction orchestrated by industrial corporations operating in indigenous territories.

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
