Parents / Carers have an important role to play in encouraging and guiding their child during the work experience programme.


We hope that this will be an enjoyable and beneficial experience for every single student.

Finding your own placement









School-found placements



To enable students to appreciate the demands, priorities, disciplines and relationships found in the world of employment.



For students to develop self-confidence and self-discipline while working with adults.



Experiences of the workplace can create social capital for young people with more limited networks



To recognise and record the use of Employability Skills.



Students will be able to reference these experiences in the future, whatever pathway they take, as part of their CV for job or apprenticeship applications, or personal statement for university.



Work experience helps them prepare for the transition from school to college, university, apprenticeships or employment.
