Dear Parents and Carers of Students in Year 12,

Thank you for your continued support during this half-term. The students themselves have been excellent during the recent trial exams. Their determination and commitment to study has been impressive. Teachers continue to mark exam papers and lessons will now start to focus on delivering feedback on how students can improve their work further. You will receive the outcome of trial exams along with updated teacher predicted grades and UCAS predicted grades on **Friday 12th June**. These predictions are provisional and not



absolute. If students are not happy with their UCAS grades, we are offering all students an opportunity to sit “Autum Tests” in October 2026. This will provide further evidence to teachers to support possibly improving a UCAS grade. Students will sit a further round of formal trial exams in Year 13 in January 2027. The key message is that students have time to work and improve on their grades, however it is important that they are putting the work in to achieve the grades they expect and using every lesson to their advantage. I will emphasise again the important of attendance to school every day.

It was great to welcome so many of you to the recent UCAS launch event this week. The feedback we have had from parents and carers has been very positive. I am very thankful to Tom Maude from University of Leicester who joined us on the evening to give his impressive insight into the world of university applications and course selection. Tom has agreed to work with us over the next year to provide further presentations to students on how they can start preparing their Personal Statement for their applications. He has also agreed to deliver another presentation later in the year regarding student finance and answer any questions around this area. We are committed to ensuring that all our young people (as well as their parents) have the best possible advice to help them make the best decisions for their future. This is such an exciting time for our young ones, and we remain committed to giving them the best chances.
